

Challenges and Considerations:



- 4. Policy Compliance: Regular monitoring and evaluation are essential to assess compliance with the policy and address any challenges or concerns that may arise.




Implementation Strategies:



5. Increased awareness and participation of students and staff in environmental conservation efforts.


Challenges Faced:


Outcomes:




